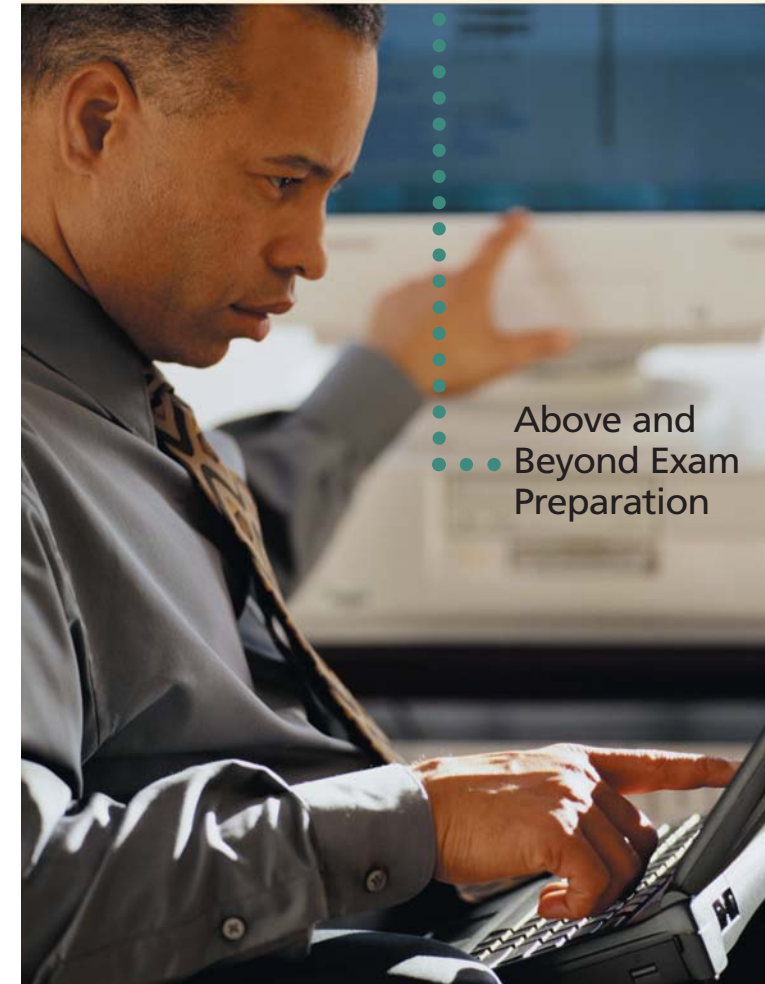

Real Classroom Instruction...Plus

The Certificate is comprised of six courses, all taught in Jersey City, just minutes from the Holland Tunnel, Path stations and the light rail system. Each course is 15 weeks, with one 3 hour evening class per week. That is 50% more instructional time than many programs,



so you get a depth of understanding that most programs don't offer. The faculty all have experience in the field as well as academic credentials. You have the opportunity to interact with your professors and fellow students. Plus, if you have to miss a class, a website helps you keep up. The special Foundations course gives you the tools you need to succeed in the entire program.

The six required courses are:

- Foundations of Professional Financial Planning
- Risk Management, Insurance and Employee Benefits
- Investment Planning and Portfolio Management
- Personal and Business Income Tax Planning
- Retirement Plans and Planning
- Estate and Succession Planning

Feedback as You Go

Each class includes quizzes plus a final exam that uses the same type of format as the Certification Examinations. You are not left wondering if you have learned the subject well enough to pass the exam. You build experience with case studies that you discuss with your professor and classmates. At the



conclusion of the program, you take a comprehensive exam that gives you complete feedback on the topics in which you excel and those in which you can use more work. When you sit for the exam, you have confidence that you know the material.

Admission to the Program

Candidates must have a baccalaureate degree from a regionally accredited college or university with a 2.75 GPA or higher. If your program did not include courses in Accounting I and II, Macroeconomics, Microeconomics, Managerial Finance and Pre-Calculus for Business or equivalent, NJCU recommends that you take these courses before starting the Certificate program. If you have substantial experience in the field, some prerequisites may be waived. Tuition and Fees

Textbooks cost \$150 to \$250 per course, and you will need to have a Windows personal computer with Internet access and email. The NJCU Academic Computing Center and Library provide access to computers 7 days per week.

Continuing Professional Education Credits

If you are a CPA, EA or CFP Certificant, some of your courses will count as Continuing Education toward your professional requirements. New Jersey City University is a recognized provider of Continuing Professional Education credits for CPAs and Continuing Education for CFP® certifiants. It will provide continuing education credit for courses in the Certificate program for CPAs and Enrolled Agents.

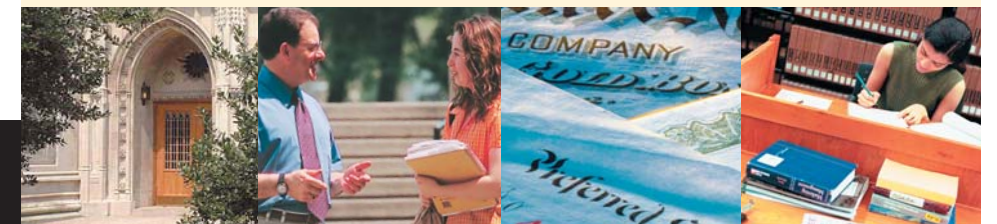
