Evaluations will be impressionistic and personal, by committee consensus, and with decisions final.</li> <li>· Tuition grants will be paid directly to the Bursar/Registrar of the University concerned –under NO circumstances will payments be made directly to awardees.</li> <li>· All applicants must be U.S. citizens. No Scholarship will be awarded to students attending foreign universities or schools not US-accredited.</li> </ul>

(ISC)2</a>	<a href="https://www.isc2.org">https://www.isc2.org</a>	Fall 2008	International Information Systems Security Certification Consortium, Inc., also known as (ISC)2, maintains a Scholarship Fund to provide financial assistance to those who are actively pursuing full-time post-graduate studies and research in the field of Information Security. Currently there are eight scholarships awarded globally. The recipient must be a post-graduate full-time student, in good standing, pursuing a university-approved research project in furtherance of an Information Security program at an accredited, nationally recognized University. Furthermore, the recipient must be of good moral and ethical character and best represent information security professionalism. The duration of the scholarship is for one academic year, but may be consecutively renewed subject to all criteria being met, or applied to multiple research projects. The scholarship shall be known as the "(ISC)2 Information Security Scholarship" and is awarded by the Scholarship Committee of (ISC)2. In order of priority, the criteria that will be used by the Scholarship Committee in determining scholarship recipients will be: (1) Relevant research; (2) any (ISC)2 designation; (3) Financial need.

<a href="http://www.dhs.gov">Department of Homeland Security</a>	<a href="http://www.ora.gov/dhse/d/2008pages/fellowship.html">http://www.ora.gov/dhse/d/2008pages/fellowship.html</a>	Fall 2008	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• You must be a U.S. citizen as of the application deadline.</li> <li>• If you have earned a master's or doctoral degree as of the application deadline, you are ineligible.</li> <li>• If you are pursuing a DVM, MBA, MD, joint MD/PhD, JD, or joint JD/PhD degree, you are ineligible.</li> <li>• You must have a cumulative undergraduate GPA from the institution granting your bachelor's degree of 3.30 or higher on a 4.00 scale, including fall 2007 grades if enrolled during that term.</li> <li>• If you are currently enrolled in graduate school, you must have a cumulative graduate GPA of 3.30 or higher on a 4.00 scale, including fall 2007 grades.</li> <li>• You must be pursuing a doctoral or master's degree with a thesis requirement in a homeland security science, technology, engineering or mathematics (HS-STEM) field with interest in a homeland security research area. See Research Areas List.</li> <li>• If you are a college senior as of the application deadline, and you will graduate prior to fall 2008, you are eligible.</li> <li>• If you have previously earned a bachelor's degree but are not currently enrolled, and you have completed no more than two graduate courses since completion of a bachelor's degree, you are eligible.</li> <li>• If you are enrolled full-time in the first year of a PhD program as of the application deadline, and prior to fall 2007 you had completed no more than two graduate courses since completion of a bachelor's degree, you are eligible.</li> <li>• If you are enrolled full-time in the first year of a master's program as of the application deadline, and prior to fall 2007 you had completed no more than two graduate courses since completion of a bachelor's degree, and you will begin a PhD program in fall 2008, you are eligible.</li> <li>• If you are enrolled part-time in graduate courses and wish to enroll full-time in a PhD or master's program in fall 2008, and as of fall 2008 you will have completed no more than two graduate courses since completion of a bachelor's degree, you are eligible.</li> <li>• If you are a veterinary medical student who is enrolled at an accredited school or college of veterinary medicine and who is currently in the fourth year of a professional curriculum leading to the DVM or VMD degree, and who will begin a postgraduate course of study in the 2008-2009 academic year leading to a PhD degree, you are eligible.</li> <li>• If you have any commitments such as active military service, summer field work, or study abroad, that would prevent you from attending school full-time, attending the fall 2008 orientation meeting and participating full-time in a 10-week internship during the summer of 2009, or accepting an employment offer following receipt of your degree, you are ineligible.</li> </ul>

Submit no less than three character references; 4. Submit a proposed budget for the use of the scholarship award; 5. Submit a certified statement from the student's faculty advisor or the institution attesting: a. That the applicant is a post-graduate in good standing with the relevant department; b. That the applicant is pursuing a defined and university-approved research project in information security; c. That the faculty advisor and/or institute will refund to (ISC) <sup>2</sup> any funds paid if the applicant withdraws from studies or discontinues work on the research project during the scholarship term.	Name : (ISC) <sup>2</sup> The total amount of a single scholarship per academic year shall not exceed <u>USD\$12,500</u> . This money may only be used for tuition purposes and/or to further a defined and university-approved research project of a post-graduate student and is not for living expenses.  <u>(8 scholarships available)</u>	(ISC) <sup>2</sup> , Scholarship Committee, P.O. Box 230326, Montgomery, Alabama 36123-0326, USA.	Scholarship applications must be submitted no later than 30 April of each year. Awards will be announced no later than 30 June of the same year.  Winners are required to inform (ISC) <sup>2</sup> of the results of their research work at the conclusion of the scholarship period, whether the research is final or not.
